The Cities Advisory Committee is responsible for helping to inform the Commission and Executive Officer on all germane items relating to San Diego LAFCO's regulatory and planning responsibilities affecting cities. The current Committee has been called by the Executive Officer to review and provide ongoing feedback on LAFCO's FY2024-FY2025 adopted workplans. All 18 cities in San Diego County are represented on the Committee by the city manager or their designee and have one vote. Each city may also appoint one or more alternates. The Executive Officer is also a non-voting member and serves as moderator and is responsible for scheduling meetings.

The Committee will hold the December 19, 2024 special meeting in person at the County of San Diego Administration Center (1600 Pacific Highway, Room 302, in San Diego). Three-hour visitor parking is available using the Ash Street entrance. In person attendance by the public is welcomed. a) Approval of Meeting Minutes for March 14, 2024 (action)

The Committee will consider draft summary minutes prepared for the last meeting held on March 14, 2024. Staff recommends approval as presented. (Page 5-12)

b) Update on 2024-2025 Workplan (information)

The Committee will receive an update on the adopted workplan and activities associated with the 30 special projects set for 2024-2025. Two projects are complete and headlined by a municipal service review on the Oceanside region. Another 14 projects are underway and marked by the Commission's three highest priorities for the fiscal year involving municipal service reviews on healthcare districts, wholesale water services, and the San Diego Association of Local Government. An amendment to the workplan involving the addition of an informational report on public recreation enhancement opportunities at City of San Diego owned reservoirs is anticipated to be presented to the Commission as early as February 2025. c) Approved Policy on Conducting Municipal Service Reviews (L-106) (information)

The Committee will receive an update on the recently approved Legislative Policy 106 (L-106) and its governing provisions related to conducting municipal service reviews. The policy – approved by the Commission in November 2024 – formalizes existing practice to provide all subject agencies an opportunity to review complete draft reports on municipal service reviews prior to their public presentation. Additionally, the policy extends the courtesy to also include all draft recommendations. Other amendments include addressing the role of performance metrics. The item is being presented for information. (Page 23-42)

5. BUSINESS ITEMS

a) Draft Policy on Public Member Appointments (discussion)

The Committee will review a draft policy to establish rules and procedures in making regular and alternate public member appointments. The item ties to the adopted workplan and presented in advance of the current regular public member's four-year term expiring in May 2025. The draft builds on recent practice and feedback provided by the Commission at its December 2, 2024 meeting and collectively aims to create a clear and known process. Central provisions include tasking the Executive Committee to screen nominate two or more applicants for full Commission consideration while also allowing nominations from individual Commissioners. The draft also provides for expedited reappointments. Staff anticipates drawing on the Committee feedback in presenting a final draft version to the Commission for action in February 2025. This includes a comprehensive review of the San Diego County Water Authority and a proportional review of the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California. The MSR on SANDAG will study the agency, and in particular three service functions oriented towards the Commission's growth management interests and involving: (1) transportation, (2) regional housing, and (3) climate adaptation. MSR Update on Healthcare Districts in San Diego County (information)

The Committee will receive an update on the current adopted workplan focusing on one of San Diego LAFCO's highest placed priorities and involving a Municipal Service Review (MSR) on healthcare districts in San Diego County. The MSR will cover the four healthcare districts in San Diego County including: Fallbrook, Palomar, Grossmont, and Tri-City. The review will be divided into two parts and will encompass: an overarching analysis of the district's services (macro report), followed by a detailed examination (micro report).
