SUMMARY

Proposed Sphere of Influence Actions | Oceanside Region

Item presented to consider proposed sphere of influence updates for three affected local agencies in the Oceanside region under LAFCO oversight involving City of Oceanside, Oceanside Small Craft Harbor District, and Morro Hills Community Services District (CSD). The item drew on the recent municipal service review on the Oceanside region and recommendations to proceed with limited updates for all three subject agencies and marked by affirming all three existing sphere designations with no changes. A special study area was separately recommended for the Morro Hills CSD. No special study areas were recommended for the other two subject agencies. Recommendation to approve updates to affirm without changes the spheres of influence for all three affected agencies in the Oceanside region while also establishing a special study area for Morro Hills CSD.

**Quarterly Update on High Priority Project and Related Actions |
Ad Hoc on Resource Conservation Districts – 2.0**

Item presented to receive a scheduled update on a high priority workplan project involving all three local resource conservation districts (RCDs) – Greater San Diego, Mission, and Upper San Luis Rey – in San Diego County. The workplan project is termed “RCDs’ 2.0” and currently focusing on mapping potential and otherwise orderly boundary changes covering all three subject agencies. The update provides the Commission the opportunity to revisit the project and provide real-time input to LAFCO staff in proceeding forward. The update also – pertinently – includes a recommendation for the Commission to transition 2.0 from its current six-member Ad Hoc format to a less informal working group to provide more flexibility in advancing the project. Recommendation to approve the proposed amendments with an immediate effective date.
